This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

At Lostwithiel Primary School we implement the music curriculum through the pathway of the 'Charanga' Scheme. Each module is carefully broken down with support and guidance for all staff to be able to deliver high quality music provision across both key stages.

The scheme ensures our pupils sing, listen, play, perform and evaluate. Each class has a weekly music lesson of approximately 40- 45 minutes. Alternatively, sometimes these sessions may be blocked over a week for particular projects. The elements of music are taught in the classroom lessons so that children are able to use some of the language of music to dissect it, and understand how it is made, played, appreciated and analysed. Composing or performing using body percussion and vocal sounds is also part of the curriculum, which develops the understanding of musical elements without the added complexity of an instrument.

In addition to this, we are supported by Cornwall Music Hub who deliver whole class instrument tuition e.g. samba drums and steel pans.
