

timeline	A list of events organised in chronological order.	continent	A large area of land made up of several countries.
past	A time before now. The history of a person or place.	ocean	One of the 5 large areas of sea on the Earth's surface.
before	In front of or preceding.	Equator	An imaginary line that runs around the middle of the Earth.
after	Next to or following on from.	voyage	A long journey.
century	A period of 100 hundred years.	Christianity	A religion based on the life and teachings of Jesus.
merchant	A person/company who trade (old fashioned word for salesman).	explorer	A person who investigates a new or unfamiliar place.
